The download you received is a copy of an original document held by The National Archives, London, England, in the collection of the High Court of Admiralty (HCA). This document is one of many records giving proof of early modern transmaritime and transcontinental entanglements. It survived due to the naval powers' common practice of prize taking in times of war.

AN APPEAL FROM THE BAHAMA ISLANDS.

Case on Behalf of the Captors and Appellants.

Capture, 17th Jan. 1814. THIS ship, under Swedish colours, laden with a cargo of beef, pork, flour, soap, lard, and butter, and bound on a voyage from Newport in Rhode Island to the Havanna; whilst in the prosecution of such voyage, was captured by the private ships of war Brilliant, William Smith, commander, and Dash, John Pinder, commander, and carried to Nassau in New Providence, where the ship and cargo were proceeded against as prize.
